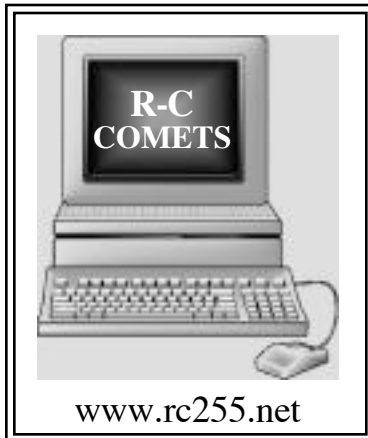

Registration

Registration signals the beginning of every school year, and I have summarized the important registration information below:

All present Reed-Custer District students, and students new to the district, will be required to register at the Reed-Custer Middle School from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 2nd, or from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 3rd.

This year we are again requesting for you to register on certain days[if this can fit into your schedule]:

- *Parents whose first letter of their last name begins with the letter [A - M], we would like you to register on Wednesday, August 2nd.*
- *Parents whose first letter of their last name begins with the letter [N - Z], we would like you to register on Thursday, August 3rd.*

We also [as you are aware] have sent home registration and co-curricular information in this mailing for you to review, update, or complete at home. Please be neat [black or blue ink pens to fill out the forms, and **red** pens to make changes on the forms], and be sure to bring all the forms back to the middle school for registration.

*The next two statements are extremely important ... that's why they are in **bold** print:*

- ***Class schedules will not be handed out and students cannot start school until the registration fee is paid!***
- ***Athletes will not be permitted to practice/participate until the athletic participation fee is paid and their physicals are turned in!***

High School registration fees [per child] are as follows:

*If you are on vacation, or an emergency situation arises where you are unable to come in and register on the 2nd or 3rd of August; you will have to register in the main office of the high school **after** the 4th of August and **before** August 25th (if you want your son/daughter to be able to start school on August 25th).*

Registration Guidelines

Please follow the instructions that are listed on this page, which will allow you to be able to easily navigate the registration process. The **T-1, T-2, T-3, T-4, T-5, T-6, and T-7** areas refer to the **registration map** enclosed.

At T-1 [middle school commons area - room 701/702]:

- This stop is only for new residents to the school district. The majority, if not all of you, can take a deep breath, as this is a stop that you won't have to make.

At T-2 [middle school commons area]:

- You will receive and sign for student handbooks/new textbooks that students will be using, and insurance forms [if you wish to purchase school insurance].
- You will also receive ONE registration fee form PER CHILD to fill out at this table. The work tables to your right in the commons area are there for you to fill out the fee form[s].

At T-3 [middle school commons area]:

- You may wish to stop and obtain information/hand-in information concerning free/reduced lunches. This is an important stop, especially if you qualify for free/reduced lunches. You can also prepay into your child's lunch accounts at this time [use the envelopes in the registration mailing], and pick up the high school menu for the first month of school.

At T-4 [middle school library - west side]:

- You will pay your registration fees. Please make your checks payable to ***Reed-Custer Unit District 255U***.
- You will not be able to continue the registration process until your registration fees have been paid.

At T-5 [middle school library - east side]:

- You must stop and obtain information about bus routes/approximate pickup times. This is a stop that many missed last year. Even if your child is going to drive to school, you still need to get your bus route and bus number.

At T-6 [middle school commons area]:

- **FRESHMAN PARENTS** ... you **must** bring your child's physical exams and shot records to the nurse's table.

At T-7 [middle school commons area]:

- You will go to the high school table and show your yellow receipt from paying your registration fees. At the high school table you will want to accomplish the following:
 - Turn in your student registration forms. These forms should have been reviewed/updated at home as they were enclosed in the registration mailing.
 - Pay any fines from the previous school year [make sure you get a receipt].
 - You will then receive your son's/daughter's class schedule, calendars, school picture information, and class ring information.
- **ATHLETIC TABLE FOR CO-CURRICULAR PARTICIPATION** ... If your child[ren] is/are going to participate in athletics, band, chorus, math, scholastic bowl, speech, student council, or WYSE, you **must** stop at the **ATHLETIC TABLE** and turn in your Eligibility and Record Forms, as well as the Drug Testing Consent Form. [These were all mailed home to you.]

***NOTE:** The Athletic Table will also be the location that you will sign your child up for the random drug testing that will take place this year, if he/she will participate in IHSA activities.*

- **MUSIC TABLE FOR MUSIC PARTICIPATION** ... If your child is going to participate in band/chorus, you **should** stop at the music booster table and pick up information.

AFTER STOP T-7:

- Finished!! Take a deep breath, and **CONGRATULATE** yourself on a job well done!! You may exit the middle school from the main entrance where you began your journey.

A Note From The District Office

Dear Parent or Guardian:

Reed-Custer Community Unit School District serves meals each school day. Children may buy lunch at the following prices: Elementary \$1.50, Middle School and High School \$2.00. Children also may receive meals free or at a reduced price. The reduced price is \$.40 cents for lunch.

If your child receives free or reduced price meals because of your income, you must tell the school if your household size decreases or your income increases by more than \$50.00 per month or \$600 per year. If your child receives meals because they receive food stamps or TANF, you must tell the school when you are not receiving TANF or food stamps for them. You may then fill out another application giving income information.

Application materials and further information are available at the school office and will be available at registration.

HOMEWORK HOT LINE

The Homework Hot Line is used by the staff each term as a means of communicating to you what your child will be doing in class and what the best time would be to contact the teacher, if you want to talk with him/her.

Activating the Homework Hot Line is a relatively simple process.

Step 1 Call the main number to the high school, **458-2166**

Step 2 As soon as you begin to hear the automated message, **press 5**

Step 3 Listen to the directions, which will tell you to **enter the 3-digit number** of the instructor that you would like classroom information from.

Homework Hotline numbers will be updated in September.

School Safety!!

School safety is always a concern and always a number one priority at Reed-Custer High School. We will continue to "daily" monitor the safety of the students while they are in the building.

This year, as in the past, we will be conducting the following:

Random metal detector tests: Metal detector tests [by use of a wand] will be performed periodically during the school year, as students enter the building, by the Braidwood police officers and a district administrator.

Random locker checks: Teachers and administrators will routinely inspect student lockers with at least one major inspection during each nine week grading term.

Random checks by the police dogs: Each year we allow the state police "whenever they are in our area" to bring their dogs to the high school to search cars, lockers, and classrooms.

Random checking of the security cameras: Cameras are placed throughout the building and are monitored by the school resource officer and school administrators.

Random lock down simulations: This year we will continue to familiarize students with lock down

procedures during one or more simulations.

Constant hallway supervision: During each passing period teachers are assigned stations in the hallways to supervise the students.

School safety, however, is much more than random checks or supervisory duties. It **must** be a team effort between students, parents, teachers, staff, and administrators to call attention to or to alert someone to a situation before it occurs.

*School safety is **EVERYONE'S CHALLENGE!!***

Medical Alert "Freshmen Parents"

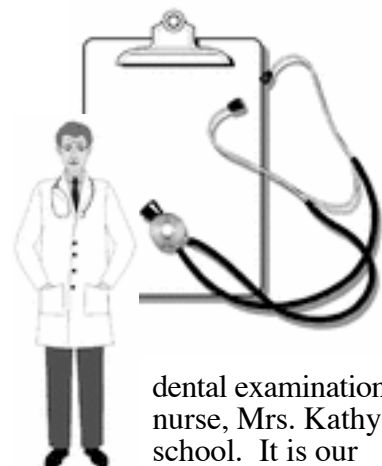
Recognizing the importance of sound health and its direct relationship to satisfactory school progress, the State of Illinois Health Examination Law requires **ALL** students entering **9th grade** to have a health examination. If proof of this examination is not submitted to the school, the student is subject to exclusion from school. Any families needing health examination forms should pick them up at the high school office **prior** to registration.

In assuming its responsibility for the enforcement of the Health Examination Law, Reed-Custer High School is requiring parents of **9th grade** pupils (or students new to the district) to submit a properly completed health and dental form to the high school prior to the start of this school year.

If for some unavoidable emergency it is not possible to obtain a health and dental examination prior to school's starting, the parent should discuss this difficulty with the school nurse, Mrs. Kathy Jones (458-2145); otherwise, it will be necessary to exclude the student from school. It is our hope that will not be necessary!!

Please Note: Freshmen athletic physicals **do not count** as a 9th grade health exams.

Make sure that you have a complete physical exam [all your shot records must be up to date], before you come to registration!!

Student Schedules

Scheduling: Students new to the school district, or students who did not have a schedule made for them last spring, may call the high school to make an appointment beginning the week of August 14th. Appointments will be scheduled by our counselors August 16th through August 18th.

Remember ... schedules **cannot** be given out or adjusted until a student's registration fees have been paid!! The counselors have also made **every** possible effort to make the best possible schedule for each student.

Important Note: On the first day of school, students **must** report to the classes that were scheduled for them during the summer or were assigned to them at the end of last year's school year. Schedule changes will be very difficult this year. Many of the high school teachers also teach at our middle school during the day. Flexibility in moving/changing schedules [that we have enjoyed over the past few years] is no longer easy and sometimes impossible to do.

* Topics: Sharing thoughts and ideas for the 2006-2007 school year.

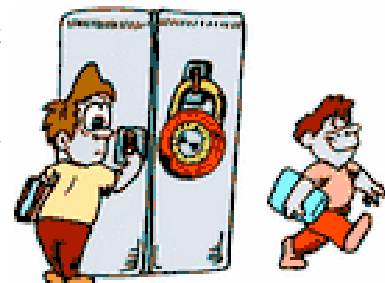
Student Orientation Tour and Locker Decorating

Confused??? Not sure where your classes will be? Afraid that you will get lost in the building? You think that you will never find your locker; and when you do, you will never be able to get it open!?!

Don't worry -- help is on the way!! On **Thursday, August 17th**, National Honor Society students will be giving a tour of the high school building. Students are to meet in the commons area at 10:00 a.m. (parents are welcome, too -- the tour will take less than an hour).

Students may also come on the 18th to find their lockers and begin the decorating process. Remember ... if you are going to decorate your locker, you must use magnets to hold up your pictures. If you don't have a lot of magnets, the most creative locker decorators have used wrapping paper on the inside of their lockers, and then used scotch tape to fasten their pictures to the wrapping paper.

Warning!! Marking the inside or outside of the lockers with pens, pencils, or markers is not allowed [as well as hanging inappropriate material ... such as signs/posters dealing with drugs or alcohol]. You are responsible for your locker, and you will be asked to clean it before or after school if we see markings on or in your locker. Also, do not store used gum, empty cans/bottles, and clothes in your lockers!



Schedule for the First Day of School

The first day of school for Reed-Custer High School students will be **Friday, AUGUST 25th**. Don't forget .. school starts at 7:50 a.m., and our first day of school is also a **full** attendance day.

Students may go to their lockers when they arrive at school, or they can remain in the commons area and visit with their friends. When the music stops playing in the hallways, the students will have one minute to report to their first class or instructional block of the day.

Once again, the high school will be using a prepay food service program for the students. Students may pay with cash, but a personal check is the desired method of payment. Make your check out to **Reed-Custer High School Food Service**, and make sure that you list the name of your child and his/her account number in the check memo space. All money transactions should take place in the main office, and your canceled check will be your receipt.

Driving to School?

Reed-Custer High School students who plan on driving a car to school must have a parking sticker for the 2006-2007 school year. The parking stickers can be obtained in the main office from Mr. Ricketts, the assistant principal. The cost of the parking sticker will be **\$15.00**.

Each student will also be assigned a numbered parking space this year. Seniors will be given first priority, with the juniors and sophomores to follow.

During the first week of school, Mr. Ricketts will also register your cars in the cafeteria during the four lunch rotations in Block 3, or before/after school.

Parking: Only seniors may use the lot to the south of the high school, next to the administration center. The lot in front of the high school is **only** to be used for teachers, staff, and visitors. All other students need to park in the north lot, across from the Dairy Queen, and enter the building by the back auditorium entrance.

Remember to make sure that you park in your assigned parking space this year!!



Dress Code and School Rule Reminders!!

Mr. Ricketts would like to stress the following excerpts from the student handbook and the school board policy concerning the **DRESS CODE**:

The dress code at Reed-Custer High School is the same as last year. The policy continues to be:



“UNDER CLOTHING MUST BE COVERED AT ALL TIMES, WITH THE PANTS WORN AT WAIST LEVEL AND WITH BELTS IF NEEDED. THE SHIRT/BLOUSE WILL BE OF A LENGTH TO COVER THE STOMACH AND THE LOWER BACK AREA COMPLETELY.”

The best rule to follow will be the one that states: **“All students should wear a top long enough to be able to be tucked into his or her pants so that no bare skin will be able to be seen on an individual no matter if they are standing, sitting, or bending over.”**

Lastly, parents please do not continue to purchase the “short shorts” .. “baggy-low cut jeans” .. or .. “low V-cut tops as school clothes. We realize the styles change from year to year and it is “vogue” or the “in thing” to fit in with the crowd. However, each and every year the styles of clothing are more and more revealing, and although appropriate to wear on the weekends or after school, the clothing selections **ARE NOT** appropriate attire during the school day.

- Students **will not** be permitted to wear tank tops during the school day.
- Students **will not** be permitted to have any type of chains hanging from their clothing or from their body while on school property or at any school event.
- Students **will not** be permitted to wear mushroom necklaces while on school property or at any school event.
- Students **will not** be permitted to wear hats during the school day [7:50 a.m.- 2:44 p.m.]

- Students **will not** be permitted to wear any type of clothing representing inappropriate subjects such as drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products on school property or at any school event. This **includes** the following:
 - *** Co-Ed Naked shirts
 - *** International 420 shirts
 - *** Mushroom shirts
 - *** Big Johnson shirts
- Students **will not** be permitted to wear any type of clothing, jewelry, or make-up that the administration deems inappropriate to wear in school.
- Students **are not** permitted to bring beverages/treats into their classrooms.
- Students **are not** permitted to have video cell phones on school grounds at any time.
- Finally, the #1 reason for detentions last year continues to be... **being tardy to school and to class.**

We certainly expect improvement in this area, TARDIES, this year!!

Please remember to review the entire handbook with your son/daughter during the first week of school. We firmly believe that the new changes in our rules and regulations will improve the academic atmosphere in the high school.

Class Ring Orders

Mr. Patrick Buschette, our Josten's representative, will be at Reed-Custer High School on Tuesday, August 29th, to present ring information to sophomore students. The presentation will take place from 9:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. in the auditorium. Ring orders will be taken during lunch periods on Friday, September 1st.

Remember, a \$40 deposit is required when you order a class ring. If you are not going to be present on the 1st, you may leave your deposit and ring information in the high school office. We will process your ring order for you.

Underclass school pictures will be taken **ONLY** on Thursday, September 14th. The pictures will be on a prepay program. The day your child has his/her picture taken, you will need to send picture money to school with your child in the envelope supplied by

The Band has had a busy summer. We enjoyed the DCI competition at ISU in June, the Summerfest Parade in July, and the Colorguard and Drumline have been working hard on the 2006 Marching Show throughout the summer. Please stop by the RCHS Music Boosters table at Registration for marching shoes, supplies, and Music Department shirt order forms. ALL Band students are required to purchase the Music Department shirt (they are \$15 and \$17 for XXL or XXXL). Band Camp will be August 1st (Freshmen, Colorguard, Drumline, and Section Leaders). August 2-4 and 7-8 for everyone. The VanderCook Leadership Conference will be August 4-5, and information will be given to those students attending. Remember the Rehearsal Under The Lights is the night before school starts! Rehearsal will begin at 6:00 PM. Our first home Football Game vs. the Wildcats is August 25, and we will be marching Pre-Game and Half Time. Again, remember to stop by the Music Booster table at Registration to turn in order forms or to pick them up. We are looking forward to an outstanding year!

2006-2007 Registration Fees:

The uniform cleaning fee of \$12.00 will be collected during Registration. The School Instrument Rental Fees will also be collected at this time. This includes: Tuba, Euphonium/Baritone, Baritone Saxophone, Tenor Saxophone, Bass/Contra Bass Clarinet. The rental fee is \$55.00 for the school year and \$27.50 for the semester. If you are playing an instrument during jazz band that is different from your own or playing an instrument for marching band that is different from your own, pay only the semester fee.

Band Homework Hotline Number:

This is a great way to get important information about an upcoming performance or homework for Theory Class. Mrs. Dennis updates the hotline message weekly, and if there is a performance upcoming, she will give detailed information. The hotline number is 458-2166 X548.

Choir Notes:

ALL RCHS Choir students are required to have a 1-inch black viewfinder binder to hold their music. Binders are sold for \$2 through the Music Department, and may be paid for at registration.

Any Choir student planning on attending the 2007 Music Department trip to Walt Disney World, FL, should purchase a Music Department Shirt. The cost is \$15 for sizes S-XL, and \$17 for sizes 2XL & 3XL.

Theater Department

This year's fall play auditions will be Tuesday, August 29th and Wednesday, August 30th. The fall play will run Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, November 2, 3, and 4 at 7:00 pm each night.



School Supplies

The school supplies listed below will get your child off to a great start at Reed-Custer High School. When you go shopping, please remember this formula ..DnOb.. "**Do Not Over Buy!!**"

During the first week of school, the teachers will provide your child with a list of items (supplies) that they will need. To get started, I would suggest the purchase of the following items:

1. Depending on how you organize yourself:
 - * Buy a 3-ring binder with multiple dividers (sections). -or-
 - * Buy separate notebooks or folders for each class.
2. Two packages of lined theme paper (with holes).
3. #2 lead pencils and black/blue pens.
4. A box of Kleenex for the students to keep in their lockers.
5. **Math** classes will require: [We highly recommend that each child owns their own TI-83 Plus Calculator]
 - * Rulers with inches and centimeters marked on them, a protractor, and compass.
 - * Advanced Algebra, Advanced Math and Trigonometry, or Calculus: 4 AAA Batteries
 - * Advanced Algebra: 5 or 6 colored pencils (recommended)
 - * Dry erase markers for seat work and board work [please, no permanent markers]
6. **Physical Education** classes will require:
 - * Complete physical education uniforms (shirt and shorts). A complete uniform will cost \$14.00 (\$7.00 for a shirt and \$7.00 for a pair of shorts).
7. **English** classes will require:

Students to purchase a Macintosh disk for writing assignments and the paperback novels that will be used in class. Physical Examinations for RCHS and RCMS Athletes

One thing that has to take place for the 2006-2007 sports seasons to begin in an orderly fashion is for athletes to have physical examinations on file in the RCHS Athletic Office. IHSA/IESA regulations stipulate that athletes must have a current physical on file in order to practice or play in contests. The following information is very important to all RCHS Athletes and their parents:

The Reed-Custer Athletic Department Physicals will be conducted on Tuesday, August 7th from 8:00 AM until 12:00 PM, in the Reed-Custer High School Commons. The cost of the physical examination is \$20.00. The Physical Form requires a Parent Signature, High School Forms may be picked up in the RCHS Main Office any week day from 8:00 AM until 3:30 PM. Physical forms for Middle and Grade School students may be picked up at the Reed-Custer Middle School.

The exams will meet requirements for Fall, Winter, and Spring Sports for the 2006-2007 school year. Remember that you can't participate in a sport without a physical examination. Don't wait until the last minute to fulfill this requirement! All athletes at RCHS and RCMS to take advantage of the physical examination dates or to contact your family physician to set up an appointment as possible. RCHS Interscholastic Record Forms, Interscholastic Eligibility Forms and Random Drug Testing Consent Forms

RCHS Interscholastic Activity Record Forms, Interscholastic Activity Eligibility Forms and RCHS Random drug Testing Forms were mailed out with Registration Materials. Only students in Athletics, Speech and Scholastic Bowl are required to participate in the Random Drug Testing Program. The forms can be returned to the RCHS at the 2006-2007 Registration on either of the Registration Days in August. You will be able to pay your Athletic Participation Fees (\$50.00) on the Registration Days. You will receive a copy of the Athletic Handbook (1 per family) which has a copy of the Code of Conduct and Random Drug Testing Policy at Registration as well.
